Everything from personal habits to state policies impact our utility bills. Energy efficiency helps customers live comfortably, reduce use, and lower bills – stretching every dollar.



Get an Energy Audit

Whether you rent or own, you can schedule an energy audit that will make your home more efficient and lower your costs.

Every 36 months, UI customers registered for Home Efficiency Systems-Income Eligible (HES-IE) can access energy efficiency programs.

To qualify, your utility company will ask for the name of the customer on the account; Complete Address; Electric and Gas, if applicable, account numbers; Own or Rent status; Total income; # of people in household; and your initials.



With one visit, an energy specialist can evaluate your home's energy performance and install basic efficiency upgrades. These include sealing air and duct leaks; installing energy-efficient lighting, faucet aerators, and low-flow showerheads; and determining the need for additional upgrades such as insulation, window, HVAC and water heater replacement.
